Rector's Reflection

What is Love? Take a moment and think on how would you answer this? We do well as Valentine's Day rolls around this month to reflect on what Love actually is. Love is more than just mere emotion. Love is demonstrated by actions. Love is commitment. Love is sacrificial. Here are a few examples from Holy Scripture that help us define the nature of Love.

May these words stir within you:

"If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." 1 Corinthians 13:1-8a

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. 'Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." John 3:16-17

'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another." John 15:12-17

In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." 1 John 4:9-11

Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, make real friends with the poor; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Romans 12:9-18

Coos Food Cupboard


For the month of February, the food cupboard would appreciate donations of canned vegetables and fruit.


A Year of Creation: How nature's seasons and Christian feasts cultivate creation consciousness Saturday, February 8, 2025

The Diocese of Olympia, in partnership with Pacific Lutheran University, invites participants to *A Year of Creation*, a one-day conference exploring how congregations can integrate nature's seasons and Christian feasts into worship to inspire care for God's creation, **Saturday, Feb. 8** at Anderson University Center, Pacific Lutheran University.

This event will feature plenary sessions, interactive workshops, and presentations from esteemed speakers, including:

- **Sheila Bristow** Composer, church musician, and collaborative keyboardist; Music Director at St. Barnabas Episcopal Church, Bainbridge Island; Affiliate Artist at Pacific Lutheran University.
- The Rev. Ruth Meyers Professor of liturgy, former dean of academic affairs at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, and author of *Missional Worship, Worshipful Mission: Gathering As God's People, Going Out in God's Name*.
- **The Rev. Jen Rude** University Pastor at Pacific Lutheran University and advocate for LGBTQ pastors and seminarians; board member of the Wild Hope Center for Vocation.
- Shari Shull Organist, choir director, and director of music ministry at Agnus Dei Lutheran Church; recitalist featured on NPR's *Pipedreams*.
- **The Rev. Benjamin Stewart** Pastor and theologian with expertise in liturgy and ecology; author of *A Watered Garden: Christian Worship and Earth's Ecology*.
- The Rev. Samuel Torvend Priest in the Diocese of Olympia, theologian, and author of *Monastic Ecological Wisdom: A Living Tradition* and the forthcoming *Jesus in Nature: A Monastic Christology*.
