


Save the Date: February 16, 2025 - Parish Annual Meeting

Human Rights Advocates of Coos County: Celebration of Life on December 21st

Dear Church Community Partner,

On behalf of the Human Rights Advocates of Coos County, we are honored to invite your congregation to join us in creating a meaningful *Celebration of Life* on December 21st. This year, our event expands and transforms the annual Homeless Persons' Memorial into a day-long multi-venue community event. This day will be filled with creative activities, community bonding and supportive spaces: fostering and honoring remembrance, unity; open to everyone.

Our new vision for the *Celebration of Life* will span multiple venues in Coos Bay, featuring shared meals, arts activities, and a candlelight memorial at the Dignity Archway. For the first time, we are inviting all community members to add the names of loved ones who have passed, honoring their memories alongside those who have experienced homelessness.

Last year, we served 125 guests a warm meal and essential supplies thanks to our dedicated volunteers and generous donations. Yet, some guests still left without the essentials they needed. This year, our goal is to raise \$4,000 to expand our offerings and provide more robust support for our guests, ensuring that everyone leaves with the items needed, a feeling of warmth, nourishment, and a sense of community.

How Your Church Can Support

There are several impactful ways for your congregation to join us in our effort:

- 1. **Pray for Our Community** We ask your church to pray for God's blessing, provision, and presence for everyone involved. Your prayers make a difference in uplifting our community to guide in creating a meaningful day of compassion & remembrance.
- 2. **Sponsor or Partner with Us** Provide support for the event through in-kind services and resources. We're especially seeking commercially prepared food donations from certified kitchens to provide a healthy breakfast, snacks and dinner for all guests.

- 5. **Share the Event within Your Church Community** Share our flyers and event information with your congregation and networks, extending the invitation to all.
