
Rector Reflection


I wanted to share a paragraph from the annual report letter from the Devereux Center we received this week. The full report will be added in the reports for the Annual Meeting, but I was so moved by this story I wanted to share it with you.

"One of our most amazing examples of collaboration this year is the story of "Timmy". Timmy has been living on the street for quite a long time. He ate out of dumpsters, sat in rain puddles, ate meat that was very rotten and the list continues. Officer Babb (Coos Bay Police Department's Community Resource Officer), Coos Health and Wellness Mobile Crisis team and more met with Timmy on a regular basis working to help him find a better path. Over and over the offers of help were rejected. Officer Babb didn't give up on Timmy. He checked on Timmy several times a week and had conversations encouraging him to consider moving into Coalbank Village. Over the course of six months (or more) members of our team, and the others previously mentioned, worked with Timmy, showing him compassion and support. Today, Timmy has been a guest at Coalbank Village for nearly a month. He is connected with a primary care provider and has been meeting with his case manager and setting goals. The support that the community gives to the Devereux Center allows us to assist people like Timmy in moving from the street into a more productive life."

This one hopeful story among a world of bad news made my day. I hope it makes yours too. And, I am so very proud of the efforts of Emmanuel Parish over the last year in supporting the Devereux center with

donations of feminine hygiene supplies, razors and shaving cream, blankets, and coats as well as a financial gift for Coalbank Village which has moved 30% of its residents into permanent housing over the last year! These small, unseen gifts of love and mercy make a real difference in the lives of our unhoused neighbors. Thank you for following Christ and opening your hearts to 'the least of these' in our community.






Coastal Families Relief Nursery Update

Exciting news! Coastal Families Relief Nursery (CFRN) was awarded a grant of \$110,000 from Advanced Health. This will be a boost to helping us get started! The Board should have a Program Manager hired and ready to start very soon. The Executive Director position is posted and interviews will start early in the new year. Once these positions are in place, other staff (teachers, assistant teachers, etc.) will be hired. At the same time, ordering has begun for the needed items to fully equip and supply the classroom and office space. It is wonderful to see so much taking shape, as we look to a spring date to open the doors to serve children and families.

Relief Nursery prevents the cycle of child abuse and neglect through early intervention that focuses on building successful and resilient children, strengthening parents, and preserving families.








Coos Food Cupboard





Pathways for Baptismal Living Courses for 2023
