

Rector Reflection

I want to tell you a bit about what I have been doing for the last month...I have been taking an intensive course in Spanish. I learned about it from one of my Dominican Brothers in the Episcopal Diocese of Puerto Rico. The course is run through their seminary, and this was a pilot program for church leaders, both clergy and lay, to work on conversational Spanish. It is a prerequisite for a month-long Spanish immersion program at the seminary that will take place in June 2025. I will be on sabbatical for three months next summer and plan to spend a month of it in San Juan practicing conversational Spanish as well as learning to preside at liturgies in Spanish. The program is not only about language, but about the nuances of Latino culture.

Now, you may be asking: Why is our Rector doing such a thing? The answer is simple: I studied Spanish in college but never actually mastered speaking in coherent sentences. I was recently challenged by some of my Latino colleagues to make an effort to become proficient. It seemed like a great thing to do since many people who come to our food pantry are Spanish speakers. I thought it would be lovely to be able to welcome them with conversation that was familiar. Likewise, there is no reason why Emmanuel could not hold a regular Mass in Spanish. There are Spanish speaking people in our community who might want to learn about Jesus Christ. Furthermore, a full third of the membership of the Anglican Order of Preachers, my religious community, are Spanish speaking. It is necessary that I am proficient to lead the Profession of Vows for our confreres in Latin America since I am the Master of the Order.

Here is what I want to say about all of it: Learning another language is a beautiful way to learn how other people see the world! Language shapes our perceptions of the world around us. It has been interesting and.... would you believe...even fun? It has been a great blessing to me, and I hope I will (eventually) be a blessing to our Latino/a neighbors.

Junior Warden's Report

Here are some highlights from Buildings and Grounds at Emmanuel Parish:

- Due to the efforts of enthusiastic volunteers, Emmanuel enters the summer season with trimmed and weeded grounds. We also will see the lawn green up when the sprinkler system control unit repair is complete.
- The crumbling garbage can enclosure has been refurbished; a project completed by members of St. Eligius Guild.
- The installation of our new security system was not easily accomplished in our "vintage" buildings, but it is now complete. Final inspection of the work will take place on July 1.
- The repositioning of the photocell that operates the illumination of the church sign should create small savings for the parish, now that the lights are not shining during the day.
- The Finance Committee has determined funding for the replacement of three of our aging furnaces and a contract with Addcox to begin work has been signed.
- The city has mandated the installation of a grease interceptor in the drain lines for the sinks in all commercial kitchens. An estimate for the installation has been received by the Vestry, and the project has been approved. There is a subsidy for the cost of this project for which we are eligible.
- Work on the roof replacement project is scheduled to begin in the first week of August.

Mosaic Over Church Entrance

The symbolism of the mosaic is concerned with the prophecy of Isaiah regarding the Advent of our Lord-"Emmanuel, or God with Us". The central motif consists of the shield of "Christ the Conqueror", a Greek Cross between the letters of "IC XC" (Iesous Christos), and the word "N I K A" (conqueror). Above is the dove of the Holy Spirit by Whose agency the Christ came into the world. Flanking the shield are two stars. On the left is the six-pointed star of the Old Testament, the "Mogen David" or "Shield of David". On the right is the five-pointed star of Our Lord, symbolic of the New Testament. Thus, the mosaic symbolizes Prophecy and Fulfillment.





We thank you, O God, for the marriage of Pierce & Chelsea. Watch over them and bless them in their new life together and help them build a home that is a haven of peace and much joy. We pray in Jesus' name. Amen.
